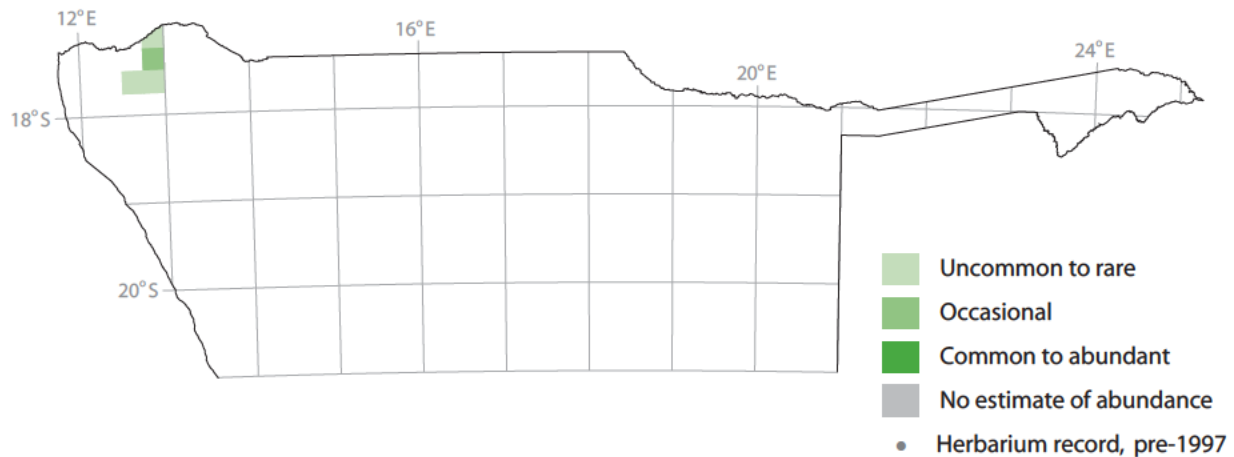


Ceraria carrisoana

Angola Ceraria

[4 records from (>0.5%) 3 squares]

A shrub or small tree with characteristic reddish-brown, waxy covering to the stems. LEAVES **ovate, succulent**, 10–20 mm long. FLOWERS very small, pink. FRUIT small, ovoid.



DISTRIBUTION & ABUNDANCE

Only recorded around the Baynes Mountains. Rare to occasional.

HABITAT

On steep, rocky hill slopes.

GROWTH FORM

Shrub or tree, about 2 m high.

ANNUAL CYCLE

FLOWERS in March; old flowers in December. FRUIT None recorded. LEAVES evergreen.

GENERAL

These are new records for the species in Namibia.

CONSERVATION CONCERNS

None recorded.
